Admission Requirements

Minimum GPA (or academic result in other scales)	<p>No minimum GPA required. However, students with a very good academic level are expected. Ranking(s) requested (if available).</p> <p>The non –degree exchange program is subject to a limited number of spots, therefore a selection of the best students is made for this program as well. Please note that a nomination does not necessarily imply the student's admission.</p>
Language requirements	<p>For scientific courses in French and/or English, a B2 level is recommended. It should be necessarily certified by an official test for our Double Degree programme (See list of accepted tests and minimum points required below). Exchange students do not necessarily need to provide language tests.</p> <p>Many 2nd year “cycle d'ingénieur” courses are taught in French. To be allowed to choose these courses, a minimal “Top” B1 “French as Foreign Language”* level is compulsory but a B2 level is recommended to feel at ease.</p> <p>For access to scientific courses in English, a minimum level of B2 in English** is required.</p> <p>Besides, for students following the Double Degree program, a B1 or B2 level in French (according to the language of the study tracks chosen) will be mandatory to get Telecom Paris Diploma.</p> <p><i>* The proof of the French language proficiency includes the following external certifications: TCF: 400 pts; TEF: 400 pts; TFI: 600 pts; DELF B2 or B1(75/100) or a higher education degree obtained from a French-speaking institution (the degree has to prove that the language of instruction was French).</i></p> <p><i>**The proof of the English-language proficiency includes the following external certifications: First, Advanced or Proficiency Certificates from Cambridge, TOEFL ITP (institutional): 543 pts; TOEFL IBT (internet-based): 71 pts; TOEIC: 795 pts; IELTS: 5.5, Linguaskill: 160 pts; Cambridge English Certificate and APTIS: B2 level or a higher education degree obtained from an English-speaking institution (the degree has to prove that the language of instruction was English).</i></p> <p><i>All tests should not be more than 2 years old (or 5 years for DELF and Cambridge exams).</i></p>
Amount of credits completed per semester	30 ECTS / semester
Double Degree programme	4 semesters (24 months), starting in September (Year 2 and Year 3 of the engineering curriculum, "Diplôme d'Ingénieur").

Health Insurance

Non-European students will have to register on <https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/> upon arrival in France in order to be covered by the mandatory French medical insurance(CPAM) that covers a part of medical expenses while studying in France.

European students will have to get a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a temporary certificate from relevant institutions of their home country, before their departure.

Non-European students are required to subscribe to a private health insurance at least valid for the first two months, before their registration with the CPAM is effective.

In general, students can also subscribe to a complementary private insurance to get a more comprehensive reimbursement of healthcare costs.

Estimated Cost of Living (in Local Currency)

Accommodation (according to the type and place) = 500 to 900 €

Food = 200 to 300 €

Private health Insurance = 50 €

Leisure = 100 €

Others = 50 €

Total per month = between 900 and 1500 €

Note that students can receive a monthly allowance from the French social organization “CAF” (Caisse d’Allocations Familiales) to help them reduce their monthly costs.
